World Handicap System

The World Handicap System (WHS) has been adopted by countries in the world to be used starting in 2020.

The idea for a new, unified system was conceived by the USGA and the R&A and developed following an extensive review of systems administered by six existing handicapping authorities - Golf Australia, The Council of National Golf Unions (CONGU) in Great Britian and Ireland, The European Golf Association (EGA), the South African Golf Association (SAGA), the Argentine Golf Association (AAG), and the United States Golf Association (USGA).

The Handicap Index is calculated using the lowest 8 of the player's most recent 20 Score Differentials and updated with each new round played. The Handicap Index travels worldwide with the golfer from courses to course (and tee to tee) and is used to calculate a "Course Handicap". The Course Handicap is the number of strokes a golfer receives from the specific set of tees at the course. The more difficult the golf coourse, the more strokes the golfer receives and vice versa.



As a golfer who competes in tournaments at your golf club, you most likely would have heard of this already. If you haven't heard of this you should ask the Pro at your golf club.

Why is it important to know what your World Handicap Index is?

The IGFR-International World Championships will be asking for your World Handicap Index so that they can correctly calculate your course handicap for each of the golf courses we will be playing in Marrakech. The rules and Regulations committee under Chairman Trevor Johnson have already implemented these important changes in the IGFR Rules & Regulations. If you do not have a World Handicap Index you will need to let us know so we can calculate your Course Handicap correctly.
